14th Street Reconstruction



The 14th Street reconstruction project suffered a two-week delay, resulting in a modified expected completion date by mid-November. The \$397,714.05 bid, was awarded to Langman Construction Co. Silvis received a Rebuild America Grant to pay for the project. Residents should expect 14th Street to remain closed between 7th Ave. and 10th Ave for the next month and a half.

Phipps Prairie Park Trail



Phipps Prairie Park received a \$97,000 grant for trail condition improvements on the east side of the park. The trail improvement partially includes

Scott's trail and all of Love Lock Loop. The trail improvements are part of a broader scope of addressing ADA enhancements near Love Lock Loop.

Future plans include a pavilion at the east entrance behind Next Door Storage, and a walking bridge linking the east to west side along Scott's trail.

Council **Updates Golf Cart Ordinance**

Public Safety Committee gathered to review a drafted ordinance on September 25th, to review guidelines and registration stickers, which will be required for the 2024 season. The



annual registration sticker of \$30 will be required for all golf carts in Silvis, but year-GOLF CART 2023 ly renewals will not require an annual

inspection. The yearly sticker will act as a personal ID tag on the rear of the cart, which must be visible at all times. The Silvis Police Department will host inspections as well as issue the ID sticker.

- No golf cart shall drive on a city street with a posted speed limit greater than 25 mph.
- You must be 18 or older and properly licensed to operate a motor vehicle.
- Golf carts must adhere to all safety requirements under the Illinois vehicle code 625 ILCS 5/12-709, 625 ILCS 5/12-201,625 ILCS 5/12-201
